

Using Berean Builders Science with Diana Waring’s “History Revealed” Series

Berean Builder’s science curriculum is for elementary school, while Diana Waring’s “History Revealed” curriculum is focused on high school. However, the curriculum does have elementary activity books, so if you have elementary students following “History Revealed,” you might want to try to synchronize your science with it.

There is no perfect way to synchronize Berean Builders science with a history course, because of the way science progressed. Nevertheless, if you are trying to make your study of science consistent with “History Revealed,” here is the rough way the timelines work together.

Unit 7:	Lessons 68-90 in <i>Science in the Ancient World</i> Lessons 1-15 in <i>Science in the Scientific Revolution</i>
Unit 8:	Lessons 16-90 in <i>Science in the Scientific Revolution</i>

It would be very hard to do all the lessons in Berean Builders Science along with the “History Revealed” series, because these three books cover more history than the five books of Berean Builders science. The best way to use these two series together would be to start *Science in the Beginning* when you start *Ancient Civilizations and the Bible*. Then, start *Science in the Ancient World* with *Romans, Reformers, and Revolutionaries*. Finally, start *Science in the Age of Reason* when you start *World Empires, World Missions, World Wars*. If you do that, your science will always be behind your history, and you can use it to review your history.
